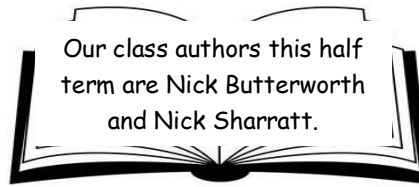
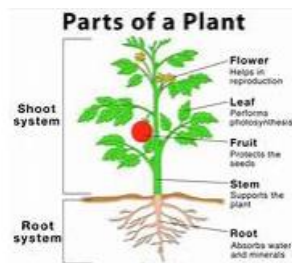
Geography

- To know what human features are.
- To know what physical features are.
- To name some human and physical features of the UK
- To know some human and physical features of seaside towns.



In **Science** we will be looking at plants and growth.

- To know the names of some garden plants
 - To know the names of some trees
- To know the names of the parts of a flowering plant
 - Observing the growth of flowers
- Identifying trees by looking at their leaves
- Conducting an experiment and talk about our results.

Key Maths learning this half term:

We will be learning to make equal groups and share equally. We will describe turns and directions using positional and directional language. The children will also be learning about numbers to 100. They will be learning how to count, partition, order, compare, and find 1 more/ 1 less than numbers to 100. They will then move on to learning about the values of coins and notes and finally how to tell the time to the hour and half then hour.

In **Art** we will be...

- Investigating marbling
- Investigating a range of textures through rubbings.
- To know how to develop tearing and cutting to create different effects.
- Sketching a weaving pattern.
- Weaving using recycled materials.

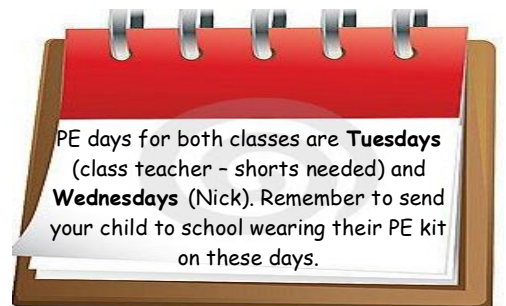
This half term the children will be continuing to learn about Christianity.
